A “Ready Return” Case Study



- Special Session of the 2007 Montana Legislature passes \$400 refund of residential property taxes paid.
- More than 242,000 Montana property owners applied for the refund, claiming nearly \$95 million in refund payments.
- Montana touts implementation as a success!

A "Ready Return" Case Study

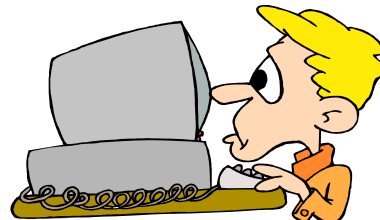
- Governor signs bill into law June 1, 2007
- Keys to successful implementation include:
 - An online information system that worked
 - Simple form and instructions
 - Critical analysis of the residential property tax database
 - Marketing efforts to inform the public



Montana Property Tax Refund

A "Ready Return" Case Study

- Montana achieves a 55% electronic filing rate for the \$400 refund!
- Direct web filing is department's first attempt at *operating* a mass population e-filing service.
 - » Through successful implementation, DOR is winning back public confidence after a failed computer system, some years ago.

A “Ready Return” Case Study

Was It All Technology?

- A key element to the success was a simple pre-populated form, the “Ready Return”.
- The “Ready Return” was mailed to 91% of the total population considered eligible, along with clear instructions.

» 72% of the population mailed the “Ready Return” received a refund.





Homeowner Property Tax Refund

The deadline to file this claim is December 31, 2007.
To speed your refund we encourage you to file electronically at mt.gov.

The 2007 Montana Legislature passed a law to refund up to \$400 of property taxes paid in 2006 (or earlier years in some cases) for your principal residence, if you meet certain qualifications.

Montana Property Tax Refund

A "Ready Return" Case Study

Analysis of property valuation data was critical in producing "ready returns" and contributing to the success of the program.

- Isolating residences from over 500,000 parcels
- Combining all properties for a single owner to minimize multiple mailings to the same owner
- Removing residential properties that are owned for commercial purposes
- Removing non-residents from data base





Montana Property Tax Refund

A "Ready Return" Case Study

Pre-Populating the "Ready Return" with good data worth the effort

- Montana Department of Revenue has a 2 ½ month window to be ready to accept refund requests through December 31, 2007

Refund Requests Denied	Cumulative Filings	% Denied Filings To Total
2,237	242,510	0.922%

A “Ready Return” Case Study

Marketing the \$400 Refund to the Public



- Letters and pre-populated returns mailed to taxpayers
- Generic forms made available in public places statewide including Montana Department of Revenue offices, county courthouses, libraries and our website
- Articles posted in the department’s newsletter, as well as stories run in the media
- Governor emailed all state employees describing the refund program

A "Ready Return" Case Study



Marketing the \$400 Refund to the Public

- Department hired increased staff and provided a toll-free telephone number
- \$400 Property Tax Refund posted on State of Montana Website, along with video tutorial on qualifications and electronic form and instructions
- Public Service Announcements from the Governor run on radio and television
